RIROUNDTABLE MEETING ON SOCIAL COHESION IN DISTRICT HYDERABAD, SINDH





On April 13, 2023, CSSP Hyderabad organized a Roundtable meeting on Social Cohesion. During the meeting, many important decisions and recommendations were put forth for the protection of minorities in district Hyderabad, Sindh including the establishment of peace committees and fact-finding committees, organizing open forums and katcheries, implementing safety measures for places of worship, prioritizing development projects in minority areas, addressing issues related to force conversion and double marriage, and appointing focal persons from minority communities. Distinguished guests representing various line departments, communities, religious, and political parties, as well as the district government, including Pir Mohammad Shah, D.I.G. Hyderabad, attended the event.

EMERGENCY RESPONSE: CSSP'S EFFORTS IN CYCLONE BIPARJOY RESPONSE IN SINDH, PAKISTAN

In response to Cyclone Biparjoy on June 16, 2023, Civil Society Support Program (CSSP) initiated various measures to provide assistance and support. CSSP prepared a Cyclone Biparjoy Sitrep" to keep stakeholders informed about the ongoing situation and to provide insights into its own response efforts. Additionally, CSSP focused on raising awareness about emergency situations and precautionary measures and established a coordination group to ensure collaboration and communication among organizations and authorities. CSSP also offered volunteer services for emergency response and shared essential information with district administration and the District Disaster Management Authority (DDMA). Moreover, CSSP, also participated in a general coordination meeting with UNOCHA to enhance overall coordination and information sharing.

ONE DAY SEMINAR ON PROTECTION OF MINORITIES: DEBRIEFING ON TERMS OF REFERENCES FOR FACT FINDING & PEACE COMMITTEES AND MINORITY FACILITATION DESK, HYDERABAD, SINDH





Civil Society Support Program collaborated with DIGP Office to organize a seminar on minority protection mechanism, newly formed fact-finding and peace committees, and the establishment of minority facilitation desks in Hyderabad Range. Chaired by Syed Pir Mohammad Shah, DIGP Hyderabad Range, the seminar aimed to foster interfaith harmony, strengthen communication between the police and the community, and ensure peace and harmony at the regional level. With a strong focus on safeguarding the rights and safety of religious minorities, the event witnesses the exchange of terms of reference for the committees and desks, as well as discussions on their efficient operations in collaboration with community and religious leaders.

CSSP FACILITATES COORDINATION MEETING AMONG PUBLIC SECTOR DEPARTMENTS TO TACKLE GENDER-BASED VIOLENCE IN DISTRICT SANGHAR, SINDH

Under the project Power to the Youth, the Civil Society Support Program (CSSP) organized a meeting with focal persons of various Public Sector departments on June 8, 2023, chaired by Mr. Abid Ali Baloch, SSP Sanghar, Sindh. The meeting brought together district-level departments, including the Police department, Women Development Department (WDD), Bar Association, Shelter Home, District Information Department, District Administration, Social Welfare Department (SWD), and NGOs/INGOs. The primary objective of the meeting was to improve the coordination mechanism among these departments in district Sanghar, with a particular focus on responding effectively to the needs of youth and survivors of gender-based violence (GBV). The meeting aimed to ensure that each identified case is facilitated efficiently in collaboration with officials from the respective district WPC, SWD, and WDD.







LINKAGES BUILDING SEMINAR OF UMERKOT CITIZEN FORUM AND DISTRICT WOMEN GROUP REPRESENTATIVES WITH PROVINCIAL STAKEHOLDERS (DUTY BEARERS AND RIGHT HOLDERS)

The Civil Society Support Program organized a linkages building seminar in Karachi, bringing together Umerkot Citizen Forum (UCF), District Women Group (DWG), and provincial duty bearers to address social cohesion challenges. The seminar focused on implementing Acts, Policies, and Laws at the grassroots level and promoting equal citizenship rights for minorities of faith and belief. During the event, the UCF/DWG presented a Charter of Demand, which included issues like Hindu marriage registration, inclusion in government committees, access to minority funds, women constables in police stations, and protection of minority religious sites. The Sindh Human Rights Commission Chairman acknowledged the demands and shared initiatives taken by the commission. Various departments expressed commitment to collaborate and discussed ongoing initiatives related to child protection, social development, senior citizen welfare, minority funds, and women empowerment. The seminar concluded with the establishment of community groups in each Union Council to survey and protect Hindu graveyards and religious sites, facilitating the resolution of social cohesion issues faced by Umerkot and its citizens.

EMPOWERING YOUTH IN HYDERABAD, SINDH: TRAINING FOR YOUTH LEADERS CORE GROUP TO PROMOTE ACTIVISM AND ENTREPRENEURSHIP





The Civil Society Support Program, under the Shared Future Socio-Economic Cooperation for a Better Future Project, has taken a significant step towards empowering the youth of Hyderabad by conducting a training for the Youth Leaders Core Group. This inclusive training, held in two union councils of Hyderabad, involved the participation of 54 young individuals in two batches, comprising 29 majority and 25 minority youth, with equal representation of boys and girls. The training focused on essential topics such as activism, leadership, and enterprise development, aiming to develop leadership skills, foster an entrepreneurial mindset, and encourage activism among the youth.
